## SIERRA BONITA RANCH

Established in 1872 by Col. Henry Clay Hooker, the Sierra Bonita Ranch became the first permanent cattle ranch in the Arizona Territory. Originally the Sierra Bonita spread was 90 miles long and 27 miles wide, featured tall grass and was blessed with fresh water Cienegas. Named after the beautiful wild flowers that covered the nearby mountains, the Sierra Bonita is an iconic ranch that has stood the test of time.

Col. Henry Hooker obtained contracts to provide beef to the Army and the Indian Agencies. During these early years of fulfilling beef contracts with the military outposts, Col. Hooker was also improving the quality of his cattle herd.




When the Sierra Bonita was first established, 15,000 head of cattle were trailed in from Texas. These Longhorns and Corriente cattle were hardy breeds that could survive anywhere, but were not optimum beef cattle. It was not long before Hooker introduced Durham and Hereford cattle. Now, 150 years later, some of the original genetics are still viable and Hereford cattle still roam the Sierra Bonita.

Since 1872 cattle have been branded with the "Crooked H", one of the oldest continuously used brands in Arizona, and today Jessie Hooker Davis, the sixth generation direct descendant of Col. Henry Hooker, continues to operate the Sierra Bonita Ranch.
